

UNMDGs Team Planning Sheet — Part II

Today, you have a meeting scheduled with the other Information Analysts at the United Nations who have been researching the same UNMDG as you. Each of you will need to share your Gapminder data scenarios with each other. Together, you will need to choose the one Gapminder data scenario that you think best makes a case for your team’s UNMDG being achieved by 2015.

Then, you will need to prepare a three-slide PowerPoint presentation about your UNMDG. Your team will later present this information to the Giving Committee of the global philanthropic organization known as “Thrive by 2015.” You will only have a few minutes to present your data and arguments to the Giving Committee. To be respectful of the Committee members’ time, you have been asked to ***strictly follow these guidelines when developing your presentation:***

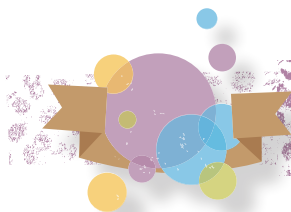
THRIVE BY 2015 GUIDELINES

1. All team members’ unique TinyURLs and notes must be reviewed by all team members prior to preparing your presentation, so that the best presentation can be produced from all team sources. The Giving Committee members are looking for presentations that include statistics relevant to the UNMDGs and show the state of the UNMDG issue (past, present, and future).
2. To be considered by the Giving Committee, all presentations or posters must contain three essential slides (or images), as described in the table below.

Slide #	Required Contents
1 Title	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • UNMDG title and all team member names. • In bulleted points, write three strong trends that you witnessed or ideas that your team now has about the future of this UNMDG. • Additionally, you may write or speak about any surprising facts your learned during your research.
2 Tiny URL	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The team’s preferred TinyURL. • The team must transfer the preferred TinyURL either by cutting and pasting from the Gapminder page, or by typing it from one of the team member’s worksheets. • If a computer is present, the Committee will want to see the TinyURL in motion. While the Gapminder graph is in motion, team members must point out interesting trends and how they relate to the UNMDG.
3 Reflection	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Include all evidence from your team’s research that could persuade the Committee of the feasibility or possibility that progress has been made toward meeting the goal in 2015. • This is the place for providing the evidence to convince the Committee that their philanthropic gift to fund your team’s specific UNMDG will be a smart investment.

Please review the rubric below, which will help you to assess each team's presentation. Then, document your assessment of the seven other teams (you will not grade your own team) in the tables below. For each determinant (listed in Column 1), document your assessment by writing in each row the quality rating for each dimension you witnessed by each team. Finally, choose the top three UNMDGs that you think should receive funding.
